RULES: Current High Power Rifle Rules will govern.

ELIGIBILITY: open to any individual member of the NRA or a member of an NRA affiliated Junior Rifle Club.

ENTRIES: Entries will be made by using the enclosed registration card accompanied by check or money order. Circle the number of each event in which you wish to fire. Be sure to indicate your correct NRA classification and NRA member number. Mail entry card immediately with correct fees to:

ENTRIES CLOSE: Individual match entries must be received no later than June 7, 2007.

Entries limited: Entries are limited to 100 competitors.

Post Entries: Post entries will be accepted up to the stated limit of the range, provided such entries will not require the squadding of extra days.

FEES: \$50.00 per competitor, includes both days and \$9.00 NRA fee

TIME OF FIRING: Firing will commence each day at 9:00 A.M

SOUVENIR PINS: Will be given to each individual who competes.

SQUADDING: All matches will be squadded. Squadding tickets for individual matches will be issued from the Statistical Office. No squadding tickets will be issued on the range. Competitors must call for these as soon as they arrive. **NRA Membership numbers and classification cards must be exhibited before squadding tickets will be issued.** Squadding information for team matches will be announced on range. A competitor who fails to present himself at the proper firing point when his relay is called may lose their right to compete in that event.

CLASSIFICATION: The NRA classification system will be used in all matches. Unclassified competitors will compete in the Master Class. Rule 19.6 – Assigned Classification, or 19.2 – Temporary Classification, may be used in making entry in an NRA Regional tournament.

RIFLE ALLOWED: NRA Match Rifle – Rule 3.3; or service Rifle – Rules 3.1, 3.3.1, or 3.1.2. There will be two divisions of Regionals: NRA Match Rifle and the Service Rifle.

SIGHTS: Metallic only – Rule 3.7a

TARGETS: NRA Official Targets—200 yards – SR target. 300 yards – SR- 3 targets. 600 yards – MR – 1 Target. (Any Regional which is fired at 500 yards must use the MR target for the 500 yard matches.)

SIGHTING SHOTS: Sighting shots, Rule 9.2, which are allowed in the conditions for each match may be taken and recorded. Sighting shots may be taken in a position than specified for the match, but such position must be one of those described in Rule 5 of the High Power Rifle Rule Book, except 5.13.

COURSE OF FIRE 2007 REGIONAL JUNE 9

Match 1- 2 sighting shots and 20 shots for record, standing, slow fire, SR target Rule 5.12 200 yards

Match 2- 2 sighting shots and 20 shots for record, sitting or kneeling from standing, rapid fire, SR target Rule 5.8 or 5.10 200 yards

Match 3- 2 sighting shots and 20 shots for record, prone from standing, rapid fire, SR-3 target Rule 5.6 300 yards

Match 4- 2 sighting shots and 20 shots for record, prone, slow fire, MR-1 target Rule 5.6 600 yards

June 10

Match 5- 2 sighting shots and 20 shots for record, standing, slow fire, SR target Rule 5.12 200 yards

Match 6- 2 sighting shots and 20 shots for record, sitting or kneeling from standing, rapid fire, SR target Rule 5.8 or 5.10 200 yards

Match 7- 2 sighting shots and 20 shots for record, prone from standing, rapid fire, SR-3 target Rule 5.6 300 yards

Match 8- 2 sighting shots and 20 shots for record, prone, slow fire, MR-1 target Rule 5.6 600 yards

Match 9- Slow fire aggregate of matches 1,4,5, and 8

Match 10- Rapid fire aggregate of matches 2, 3, 6, and 7

Match 11- REGIONAL CHAMPION: Aggregate of matches 1 through 7

Categories and Classes In Fired Matches: The classes are: High Master, Master, Expert, Sharpshooter, and Marksman, provided that there are sufficient entries in a class to warrant awards.

Award Disposition: There must be 2 or more entries in a class for one award, 8 or more for two awards; and 13 or more for three awards. If there are fewer than 5 high Masters entered, they must fire for open awards only. The High Master Class may not be combined with the Master Class.

If there are fewer than required number of entries in a class to provide awards they will be combined with the same class in another category. If there are still fewer than 2 entries after combining all the categories of a class, there will be NO AWARDS provided in that class, and all competitors in the lower class will be moved back to their respective category in the next higher class, until there are a minimum of 5 competitors in the combined class.

An individual winning a place award – Winner, 2nd, or 3rd Open – shall be entitled to Special Awards for which he or she is qualified, but may not win a category/class award in the same match. To be eligible for special awards, the individual must indicate in the entry card (SR – 1) any and all special awards for which he or she is eligible.

Regional Championship Awards: Match 8

Winner: NRA Regional Gold Medallion

2nd place: NRA Regional Silver Medallion

3rd place: NRA Regional Bronze Medallion

Cash awards to be given according to posted award disposition after match certification.

Class winners will receive \$40 Camp Perry credit.

From I 80 – Leave I 80 at Milesburg, go South on Rt. 220 to Tyrone. At Tyrone, take Rt. 453 West to Rt. 253. Turn South on Rt. 253 to town of Allemans. In center of town turn right (West) and travel ½ mile to top of hill. (Church and cemetery on right). Turn left at cemetery on dirt road. Follow signs to Range.

From Rt. 22 for Western shooters. Turn North on Rt. 53 at town of Cresson. Follow Rt. 53 to town of Van Ormer. Turn right on Rt. 253 to Allemans. Turn Left (West) in center of town and proceed as above.

From Rt. 22 for Eastern shooters. Turn North on Rt. 220 at Hollidaysburg. Proceed on Rt. 220 to Bellwood. Turn left on Rt. 865 at Bellwood and follow Rt. 865 to Glasgow. At Glasgow turn right on Rt. 253 to Allemans. Turn left in center of town and proceed as above.
